Unit of work Ukulele (Spring Term)


Year group

Prior learning

Link to pupil's previous knowledge or awareness of guitars. Pupils may know how to hold in the correct manner and that strings played in a strumming motion make a sound.

Knowledge/Skills

- Pupils will learn how to correctly hold a Ukulele in a comfortable and accurate playing position
- Pupils will know the key names of parts of a Ukulele (see image below)
- Pupils will learn the C, F and A chords
- Pupils will learn to play the C, F and A chords as part of an ensemble
- Pupils will learn to play both individually and part of an ensemble to a piece of music
