What is the Holy Book of Islam?

The Qur'an, sometimes spelled Koran, (Arabic: الْـ قَرْ اَلْـ قرالُ) is the holy book of Islam. The Qur'an is considered by Muslims to be "The Word of Allah (God)". This book is different from other religious texts in that it is believed to be written directly by God, through the prophet Muhammad.

What do Muslims believe about Creation?

- In the space before time began, there was just God (Allah). And when God wanted to create something, all he had to say was 'be' and it became.
- 2. God created the world and heavens.
- 3. He made all the creatures, which walk, swim, crawl and fly on the face of the earth.
- 4. He made the angels, and the sun, moon and stars to dwell in the universe.
- 5. God poured down the rain in torrents, and broke up the soil to bring forth the corn, the grapes and other vegetation; the olive and the palm, the fruits trees and the grass.
- 6. God ordered the angels to go the Earth, and to bring seven handfuls of soil, all of different colours, from which he could model man. God took the seven kinds of earth and moulded them into a model of man. He breathed life and power into it, and it immediately sprang to life.

What is the Shahadah?

The Shahadah is the first of the Five Pillars of Islam. "There is no God but Allah, and Muhammad is his messenger." This is the basic statement of the Islamic faith: anyone who cannot recite this wholeheartedly is not a Muslim.
